Course overview:

This course is about natural hazards with a focus on earthquakes, which is most likely to affect residents of the Bay Area and Southern California. Other hazards that we will cover include but are not limited to tsunamis, landslides, wildfires, volcanic eruptions, and asteroid impacts. We will discuss the societal impacts and prediction, preparation, and mitigation methods. GE credit: SE, SL
